Previous suggestions have included allocating funds to help reduce the cost of energy locally; increase energy efficiency in homes; support local business and enterprises; provide support to local foodbanks; provide training and apprenticeships; improve transport connections; supply new equipment to local clubs and societies; upgrade broadband or provide emergency safety equipment.
